Local Author's Latest Mystery Released, Set in Lee County

Fort Myers native Prudy Taylor Board's paranormal mystery, *A Grave Injustice*, has just been released in hardcover by Archebooks Publishing. Set in Fort Myers, Florida, the story deals with the ghost of Karl von Brett, a GI who training at Buckingham Flexible Gunnery Training School when the Norden bombsight was being developed. Von Brett was murdered and labeled a spy to cover up for the activities of the actual spy. Now, decades later and still determined to get revenge and to clear his name, von Brett relentlessly haunts a troubled police newspaper reporter until she agrees to investigate his murder. Along the way, she discovers her life is threatened because the murderer is still very much alive and well, still living in Fort Myers, and determined to halt her investigation.
